SAFETY & SECURITY

At SPARKS, your child's safety is our first priority. Our campus will be enclosed with a fence and the doors to the building will remain locked with limited access.

Attendance will be taken and every child will be accounted for.

Please contact us in advance if you anticipate your child being late.

Children will be under the staffs' supervision at all times.

Our staff are briefed by our security team here at Chabad, whom are in constant contact with us as well as the local police department to be aware of the latest necessary measures and updates.

If your child is not feeling well, we ask that you refrain from bringing them until they are feeling better.

WHAT NOT TO BRING TO SPARKS

1. Cell phones & Electronics

Cell phones and electronic devices are not permitted to be used during SPARKS hours. We ask that you please do not send your child with a cell phone. Cell phones tend to distract from group activities and damper the spirit. If your child needs access to a phone or other device during After School hours, please talk to them about leaving it in their bag during the lessons.

2. Valuables

SPARKS cannot take responsibility for toys, jewelry, sports equipment, or other valuables that are lost or broken during our hours.

3. Dangerous items

Dangerous items, including (but not limited to) glass and sharp or hazardous objects are not permitted on campus and will be confiscated.

4. Food & Snacks

Ckids Afterschool is a strictly kosher facility. We ask you not to bring your own food and snacks. Snacks will be provided during the classes.
